

Report of the Meeting

Items discussed:

1. Council Session

President Nele Michels presented the meeting agenda which had every participants' approval. As 28 out of 41 Council Members were present, as confirmed by Admin. Secretary Barbara Toplek, the required quorum was reached.

a) Welcome

President Nele Michels opened the Council Meeting and welcomed participants (President's ppt presentation - appendix 3). The President gave a warm welcome to our new council member, Dr. Shirin Talapbek, from Kyrgyzstan. Since last Council Meeting, the Executive Board has three new members, Dimitrios, Nynke and Vesna. Our president appreciated their hard work in all the online meetings and work between the council meetings. A special thank you to the previous EB members who also worked very well for EURACT, Adam, Francesco and Ruth. Outcomes since Sept 2020 were highlighted. Information on CME programmes on COVID-19 and pain and osteoarthritis and a proposal for funding of research were also presented.

Appendix 1 - President's report

President's Report, October 2020 - April 2021

Despite the (social) standstill, spring has begun again, trees and flowers are blooming again. And we too have started a new EURACT year. Despite the changing world, everything is still going on and we have all achieved a lot. Time to look back ...

I am delighted that we can officially welcome our 42nd country: Kyrgyzstan is now part of our organisation. I already had the opportunity to meet Dr Shirin Talapbek online, and I am happy to see her with you again at our spring meeting.

Since our last meeting (Sept 2020), a new EURACT EB was elected. Thanks to Adam, Francesco and Ruth for their work in the past, we could immediately start discussing and developing old and new projects in a ver constructive way. It is sometimes challenging, especially within the corona pandemic, but we have certainly found our way.

So have you, in the committees and the task groups. A lot of work has been done; BME guidelines and CME guidelines have been finalised and published at the EURACT and WONCA Europe website. All committees contributed to the WONCA conference (Berlin online, Dec 2020) and to the WONCA Europe World Book of Family Medicine by writing 4 chapters. Meanwhile, the committees and task forces have had meetings, started new studies or projects, reflected on the future, ... Projects and studies have also been further developed across committees and task forces. We are still working on the impact study of COVID-19 on GP training and the data from our first 'quick' study on COVID-19 have been submitted for publication. In light of the new WONCA Europe definition on General Medicine/FM and the related (new) core values, a manuscript was submitted on behalf of EURACT and accepted for a special edition of Frontiers in Medicine.

Our case-based CME project on COVID-19 is almost ready to be launched. This project, in collaboration with WONCA Europe and ISSECAM, will provide free CME to all our members and other GPs, in addition to additional funding for our organisation. With this extra budget we will be able to finance our own research if needed. At our Council Meeting more information will be given, next to information about a second CME project on Pain & Osteoarthritis.

In December, WONCA Europe highlighted EURACT in their newsletter and on their website. Also on behalf of EURACT I was invited to speak at the KBV #healsy20 Web Congress (Germany, Oct 20) on challenges in GP Specialty Training. Additionally, Martine, Alex, and I could give a lecture on 'GP education and COVID-19' on the International Trakya Family Medicine Congress (Turkye) in a session shared by Esra. Also, Pavlo was invited as a speaker at the congress.

Next to all the work we do, these invitations are important for our visibility as an organisation. We must use, accept and cherish these opportunities. In the near future we should even dare to do this more pro-actively. I am thinking of a new newsletter to send out to all our members and of using social media even more. To be continued ...

Appendix 2 - Report from EURACT representative on WONCA Europe Executive Board

WONCA Europe Executive Board continues to work exclusively online. No face-to-face took place since February 2020. Monthly virtual meetings and regular e-mail communication create a ground for daily management of the organization. Below selected matters of potential interest of EURACT are presented:

Handover of Presidency

- On 12 March 2021 Prof. Mehmet Ungan has resigned as WONCA Europe President. This decision was expected and announced already in 2019 (ten years period in EB expired in 2020).
- According to the bylaws regulations, the president-elect, Prof. Shlomo Vinker, took up the office as a new WONCA Europe President. Virtual handover ceremony was organized during WONCA Europe EB videoconference.
- Due to the vacant position of a president-elect a call for nomination of candidates has been issued and sent to all member organizations. Till the date only candidacy of Prof. Thomas Frese from Germany has been received. The postal voting will be organized shortly. WONCA Conferences
- WONCA Europe 2021 Conference in Amsterdam will be fully virtual. Due to the COVID-19 constrains there will be no face-to-face Council meeting organized during the conference. The possibility of an online Council meeting is explored now. There are plans to organize a WONCA Europe Open Meeting, which are discussed with the Dutch College of GPs hosting the meeting.
- WONCA World 2021 Conference in Abu Dhabi might be also exclusively virtual. The final decision is still missing. Most probably there will be no WONCA Europe Council meeting organized during this conference, however final decision about it is still pending.
- Preparations for WONCA Europe 2022 Conference in London are well advanced. The amendments to the contract have been made and now are under consideration of Guarant a Czech company, selected to be a core PCO for 3 consecutive WONCA Europe conferences.
- Bids for annual conferences in 2023 and 2024 have been received from Belgian and Irish colleges of GPs, which want to host the conferences. For 2024 there is a bid received from Elegeia one of the three Greek member organizations belonging to WONCA. This last application has however serious formal flaws (lack of agreement with core PCO) and most probably will not be eligible for further considerations. External collaboration
- Several groups and organizations are seeking a ground for a closer collaboration with WONCA Europe. Close working relations have been established with European Medicines Agency, World Health Organization Regional Office for Europe and European Forum for Primary Care.
- Formal proposals to establish new Special Interest Groups (SIG) of WONCA Europe have been received/. One would deal with a lifestyle medicine and the second one with the social prescribing. The last application has been submitted by EURIPA. WONCA Europe EB is exploring the details in order to prepare a background for a final decision of the Council.
- WONCA Europe will sign a Memorandum of Understanding with European Cancer Organisation, which will define the details of mutual collaboration.
- There are also plans to establish close working relationships with European Federation of Periodontology. Negotiations about the details just have been started. Financial situation
- Due to the unsure income from annual WONCA Europe conference in 2020 which in previous years contributed in roughly 50% to the budget of the organization, the financial situation is still difficult, however stable. This is mainly due to serious cuts of expenses (costs of secretariat, travels, support for the networks and the journal) as well as additional sources of income (grants, projects). The final financial report from Berlin conference is not available yet, but hopefully some income will be available to WONCA Europe.
- WONCA Europe continues to seek for savings and new sources for income to maintain financial liquidity. Again the networks were approached to explore their readiness to waive or reduce the annual financial support from WONCA Europe. They vary in responses. The one from EURACT was not received yet.







This patient is affected by rheumatoid arthritis, treated stably with Tocilizumab and Methotrexate, and has developed COVID-19 disease.

According to ACR guidelines, patients doing well on a stable dose of steroid and/or Disease-Modifying Antirheumatic Drugs should be allowed to continue the same [1], although the NICE guidelines specify that patients with known or suspected COVID-19 should temporarily stop DMARDs other than hydroxychloroquine and sulfasalazine [2]. As far as actual evidence shows, Tocilizumab (which itself was tested as a potential medication against COVID-19 [3]) should be continued also during an acute infection. Stoppage of methotrexate and leflunomide may be considered, depending on the individual patient and the decision of the rheumatologist, and for documented or presumptive infection it is recommended to stop sulfasalazine, methotrexate, and leflunomide [1]. Prednisolone with a dose greater than 10 mg was associated with a higher rate of hospitalization. Neither exposure to DMARDs nor NSAIDs were associated with increased odds of hospitalisation [3,4]. Further work is needed to understand whether immunomodulatory therapies affect COVID-19 incidence [4].

Points of action: Major topics

Non-pharmacologic treatment: Physiotherapy, patient education, aid devices


Pharmacologic treatment: 1st line treatment, posology and management for ineffective treatments, parallel conservative strategy, evaluation, advanced lines of treatment, follow-up

Individualised plan: Other medications, aging, pregnancy, comorbidities, risk factors

Referral: When to refer, to whom (physiotherapist, pain specialist, surgeon)

Pharmacologic treatment: Complexity





- > Affected area(s): Knee, ankle/foot, hip, hand, polyarticular joint
- > Severity: Mild, acute, severe
- Efficacy of interventions: Early diagnosis, timely intervention, patient-centered approach

EB Report 16 January 2021

- Reimbursement system for council members attending council meetings from low-income countries:
 - Accommodation: Three nights in a hotel can be reimbursed. The hotel bill is usually paid directly by the Hon. Treasurer. In the situation where the organiser of a council meeting does not select a specific hotel, then a council member seeking re-imbursement should look for an inexpensive option and check this with the treasurer prior to confirmation.



EB Report 16 January 2021

- Travel Expenses:
- Council members are reimbursed personally for up to 75% of their travel expenses, this is capped for each meeting at no more than double the amount of the total membership fees paid by the country that year (ref. financial report in the report of the EURACT Spring 2014 Council meeting, page 31).



Membership fees 2021

- Due to the favourable financial position of EURACT it was decided that the category bands should be adjusted so that more countries qualify for reimbursement.
- The fees are based on the Gross domestic product (GDP) per capita at Purchasing power parity (PPP) per capita as estimated by the IMF.

- I have received the task of auditing EURACT 2020 financial balance from EURACT Executive Board. This audit report is produced for presentation at the Council Meeting in April 2021. I have been presented with the following:
- Spreadsheet of all financial records of the year (2020)
- Spreadsheet of previous year (2019) financial records
- Balance account.
- Predicted budget of 2020 presented at EURACT Council Meeting (April 2020)
- The financial data are all recorded chronologically in a straightforward way, distributed into logically formed columns. The calculated sums of each column are placed in the top line, these are checked to be correct. All data are easily explainable and seem to be in accordance with the activities of EURACT.



- This has been an extraordinary year due to the COVID 19 pandemic. It is understandable that both the income and expenditure fell during 2020. There has been a significant reduction in membership fee income from 24,909,01 Euros in 2019 to 14,101.00 Euros in 2020. Many organisations are finding it difficult to collect membership fees as people have been distracted by the immediate needs of the pandemic. The support grant from WONCA Europe was also reduced to 4000 Euros from 8,000 Euros.
- This fall in income was compensated for by a reduction in expenses as courses and the conference were cancelled. The expenditure for 2020 on Courses was 5457.82 Euros as compared with 27,458.00 Euros in 2020.
- The balance on the account remains extremely healthy at 64,783.92 Euros as compared with 58,343.98 Euros in 2019.
